**Liquids, Aerosols and Gels (LAG's) Screening**

HKIA has implemented security controls on LAG's under Security Direction 1/2007 since 21 March 2007. As a result of both government and industry efforts and due to the widespread implementation of the ICAO guidelines in other States, the travelling public is becoming more aware of the LAG's restrictions. The volume of LAG's items abandoned by passengers at the screening channels has decreased significantly in recent months.

I write to advise that with effect from the end of August 2007, Hong Kong International Airport will no longer provide complimentary plastic bags for passengers' use in connection with the above-captioned. Passengers can readily purchase such at supermarkets and household product stores in Hong Kong and at the airport retail shops of T1 and T2. To this end, it would be appreciated if you could disseminate the contents of this letter among all Travel Industry Council members.

As an on going strategy, the Airport Authority would like to solicit your effort to remind the passengers and the tour leaders regarding the LAG restrictions and to well pack their hand-carry LAG before coming to the airport.
