A confirmed human case of H5N1 Avian Influenza in Guangdong (廣東)

The Department of Health is informed by Mainland's Ministry of Health today of a confirmed human case of H5N1 Avian Influenza in Shanwei, Guangdong Province. The patient was a 44-year-old woman who developed fever and pneumonia on February 16 and passed away on February 25.

To minimize the risk of contracting the disease, tour groups to Avian Influenza affected areas should avoid visiting poultry markets or places where live birds are concentrated. Travellers should take the following precautions:

- ✧ Avoid contacting patient with fever or respiratory symptoms;
- ✧ Avoid touching birds or poultry and their droppings;
- ✧ If travellers have contacted birds or poultry, they should wash hands thoroughly with liquid soap and water immediately;
- ✧ Poultry and eggs should be thoroughly cooked before eating; and
- ✧ If having a fever or feeling unwell after returning to Hong Kong, travellers should consult a doctor promptly and tell the doctor the recent travel history.
