Characteristic Local Tourism Incentive Scheme

Guide to Application¹

(Application Period: 1 January 2024 to 31 October 2024)

I. Introduction

1. The Government launched the three-year Cultural and Heritage Sites Local Tour Incentive Scheme (CHIS) in October 2022 which aimed at incentivizing the travel trade to develop more tourism products and itineraries with cultural and heritage elements. In the 2023 Policy Address, the Government announced that the CHIS would be transformed into the ‘Characteristic Local Tourism Incentive Scheme’ (‘CTIS’) to further encourage the trade to develop more thematic tours, thereby promoting the long-term and sustainable development of the tourism industry.
2. The Travel Industry Council of Hong Kong (‘TIC’) is the implementation agent of the Scheme. The CTIS encourages travel trade to design quality and unique travel products that attract overseas and local tourists to explore Hong Kong’s unique East-meets-West culture and diversity, as well as to experience distinct local characteristic.
3. The Scheme is divided into two categories, namely the In-depth Travel (‘Category A’) and Thematic Travel (‘Category B’) with different incentive amounts and quota (details on Section III). Travel agents shall read the following in detail before submitting the applications.

II. Eligibility of Applicants

The Applicant must be a travel agent that fulfils the following two conditions concurrently:

- (1) holding a valid travel agent’s licence issued under the Travel Industry Ordinance (Cap. 634) at the time when making an application; and
- (2) continuing to hold a valid travel agent’s licence when cash incentives are disbursed by TIC.

III. Cash Incentives Which Travel Agents Can Apply For

1. The Applicant is eligible to a cash incentive for each Hong Kong resident holding a valid identification document (e.g. Hong Kong Identity Card; Hong Kong Birth Certificate (for children aged below 11)) **or** traveller holding a valid travel document for whom it arranges an eligible local tour or inbound tour with local characteristics (see 2) under the Scheme. The incentive amount and quota in respect of **In-depth Travel** ('Category A') and **Thematic Travel** ('Category B') which each eligible Applicant (i.e. each eligible travel agent) can apply are as follows:

**Each eligible travel agent is allowed to convert local tourist quotas into inbound tourist quotas.*

2. An eligible tour of the CTIS refers to a local and/or inbound tour which an Applicant arranged to be departed between 1 January 2024 and 30 September 2024 (both dates inclusive) and fulfils the following criteria:

(a) The itinerary must fall into **one** of the following two categories under the Scheme:

i. **In-depth Travel (Category A)** – the itinerary must cover:

- Entering **at least two** Designated Sites of **In-depth Travel** (see Annex I). The tour shall also comply with the conservation code of practice (see Annex II), and;
- **One** tourist experience activity with Hong Kong's unique and authentic experience (the related requirements are set out in Annex III). Such activity should include interactive elements that engage tourists' participation.

ii. **Thematic Travel (Category B)** – the itinerary must:

- Carry a theme chosen from **one of the six distinctive themes** (including (1) Great Green Escapes, (2) Fun Water Adventures, (3) Legacy of Joy, (4) HK Pop Culture, (5) Journey Through National History and (6) Unconventional Journey) and provide visitors with captivating and in-depth travel experience of Hong Kong;

- Enter the tourist sites which adhere to the selected theme (the sites must be pre-registered), and shall comply with the Conservation Code of Practice in Annex II;
- One theme-related tourist experience activity featuring in-depth travel to Hong Kong with interactive elements that engage tourists' participation.
(See Annex IV for relevant requirements)

(b) The total tour duration **must not be less than 5 hours**, with at least **45 minutes** allocated for the tourist experience activity.

(c) The Applicant must register each itinerary of the **In-depth Travel / Thematic Travel** with the TIC **at least 5 working days** prior to tour departure. Pre-registration must be made through e-registration form along with the following information and documents:

i. In-depth Travel (Category A)

Tour code (shall use the prefix "CTIS"), accurate tour departure date(s), designated sites (must not be less than two), description of the tourist experience activity and detailed tour plan ([visit here](#) for the pre-registration requirements and e-registration form of the **In-depth Travel**..

ii. Thematic Travel (Category B)

Tour code (shall use the prefix "CTIS"), accurate tour departure date(s), theme-related sites, theme-related tourist experience activity with descriptions, and detailed tour plan ([visit here](#) (please choose language) for the pre-registration requirements and e-registration form of the **Thematic Travel**).

The Applicant shall complete the pre-registration for each of the local and/or inbound tour itinerary and provide the accurate tour departure date(s) as required, otherwise the application for cash incentives will not be processed.

(d) The Applicant must arrange tourist guide(s)/ tour escort(s) fulfilling the following requirements to serve tour participants with remuneration:

- holding a valid Tourist Guide/Tour Escort License issued under Travel Industry Ordinance (Cap. 634); and
- completion of any one of the recognised training courses as listed in Annex V ;

(e) The Applicant must arrange transportation (e.g. tourist coach, vessel) for carriage of tour participants;

(f) The Applicant shall arrange suitable meal(s) for tour participants (but not limited to dine-in meals);

(g) The Applicant must take out insurance for tour participants on the tour day concerned under the Scheme²;

² If a trip lasts for two days or more, travel agent must take out insurance for tour participants for the corresponding number of days.

- (h) Itineraries **shall not include** shopping arrangements made by the Applicant;
 - (i) If a tour is an inbound group tour, it must spend at least one night in Hong Kong³ and;
 - (j) The Applicant must ensure that no less than five tour participants or 10 percent of the tour participants (whichever is higher) complete the post-trip survey.
3. The Applicant must, according to the format specified by TIC, provide photographs taken at not less than two designated sites of In-depth Travel / three sites from the pre-registered itineraries of Thematic Travel (one photo at each site) visited in the course of its eligible local and /or inbound tour as a proof; such photo shall be:
 - a. taken inside the designated sites of In-depth Travel/ pre-registered sites of Thematic Travel;
 - b. properly showing the face of each tour guide/tour escort; and
 - c. properly showing tour guide(s)/ tour escort(s) holding a flag or signage with the travel agent name at the sites
 4. The Applicant must, for each tour participant of its eligible local and/or inbound, keep the name, contact number, email address (if any) and the last four alphanumeric characters (e.g. 456(7)) of a valid Hong Kong identification document of a Hong Kong resident/a travel document of a traveller for at least 6 months for verification when necessary. Each of the tour participant's name (partially hidden for the privacy protection purpose) and the last four alphanumeric characters (e.g. 456(7)) of a valid Hong Kong identification document of a Hong Kong resident/a travel document of a traveller must be provided together with the Application. In addition, the Applicant must disclose to the tour participants the reasons and purpose for collecting their personal data;
 5. Application can only be submitted to TIC after the eligible local and/or inbound tour is completed;
 6. Applicant that has used or intend to use the same eligible local and/or inbound tour under the Scheme for application for other funding support from the TIC or HKSAR Government / semi-government organisations (see Section V) is not eligible for the Scheme.

IV. Application Period and Procedures

Application period

The Applicant must submit the application to TIC in respect of the local and/or inbound tour it served on or before the last day of the month following the departure date of the tour³. Late submissions will not be accepted by TIC.

³ For example, if a tour of characteristic local tourism is organised on 25 February 2024, the application must be submitted to the TIC by 31 March 2024.

Application procedures

1. All applications must be submitted online via the designated electronic platform at TIC Website (www.tichk.org/en) > Industry Subsidy and Incentive Schemes > Characteristic Local Tourism Incentive Scheme, in accordance with the requirements set out below.
2. The Applicant must be a manager or above of the concerned travel agent.
3. According to the category of the itinerary, the Applicant shall make submission via the respective platform (Category [A](#) or [B](#)) together with the uploads of the following documents (pdf, doc, docx, jpg, jpeg, png or gif):
 - (a) Receipts / invoices which indicates name/organisation of payer, tour date, tour code, number of participants (must be the same as the number stated in the application form) and local tour fees;
 - (b) Tour itinerary (e.g. tour flyer / detailed itinerary plan which was submitted for itinerary pre-registration) indicating the tour code, designated sites as listed on [Annex I](#) for itinerary of the Category A / sites as listed in the pre-registered itinerary of Category B, tourist experience activity, and tour date;
 - (c) The participant list (by using the Excel form provided by the TIC) providing the participants' names (partially hidden owing to the privacy concern) and the last four alphanumeric characters (e.g. 456(7)) of a valid Hong Kong identification document of a Hong Kong resident / a travel document of a traveller, and indicating the tour code and tour date;
 - (d) During the local tour, photograph(s) are required to be taken at the two designated sites visited under the Category A / three sites (from the pre-registered itinerary) visited under Category B (one photo at each site; see the requirements in Section III paragraph 3);
 - (e) Receipt(s) of the transportation arranged by the Applicant for the tour participants, to which the company stamp of the transportation operator must be applied and where the tour code must be specified (if the transportation means is / are operated by the Applicant, a copy of vehicle book shall be submitted);
 - (f) Receipt(s) of the meal(s) arranged by the Applicant for the tour participants where applicable, to which the company stamp(s) of the restaurant(s) concerned must be applied and where the tour code must be specified; ;
 - (g) Receipt(s) of the insurance taken out for the tour participants on the tour day concerned under the Scheme by the Applicant;
 - (h) Certificate that evidences the eligible tourist guide / tour escort's completion of one of the recognised trainings (see Annex IV) issued by the training body concerned;

- (i) Document proof of the tourist experience activities including:
- ◆ receipt(s)/invoice(s) indicating the number of participants (must be the same as provided in the application), fees and the activity name, to which the company stamp(s) of the activity organiser / service provider must be applied and where the tour code and tour date must be specified;
 - ◆ photograph(s) of the finished products made/ photograph(s) of the participants taken during the course of the activity; and
- (j) Completion of post-trip survey by no less than five tour participants or 10 percent of the tour participants, whichever is higher (*Note: TIC will verify the number of completed questionnaires on the backend of the online survey system*).
4. Owing to privacy protection concern, the name of tour participants must be hidden on all the relevant document proofs provided by Applicants.
5. Applicants shall include only one tour of the CTIS in each application. Identical participants taking part in a continuous itinerary is regarded as one tour group.
6. When processing the applications, Applicants may be required by TIC to provide additional or supplementary information. TIC reserves the right to not further process the application if the Applicant fails to provide the required information.

Assessment of applications and disbursement of cash incentives

Under normal circumstances, TIC will inform the Applicant of the vetting result of an application within two months counting from the month in which the application is received by TIC⁴. For successful applications received in each monthly application period, TIC will disburse cash incentives to Applicants by cheque. For unsuccessful applications, TIC will notify the Applicants of the result via email.

V. Consequences of Duplicating Applications

If it is found that the Applicant uses the same eligible Characteristic Local Tour for applying for other funding support of TIC, the HKSAR Government, or semi-government organisations, they will **no longer be considered eligible for applying funding support under all local tour initiatives**, TIC will not process any other applications which are yet to be approved as submitted by the Applicant.

VII. Important Notice

1. The TIC reserves the rights to validate information in the applications submitted by Applicants with relevant service providers for vetting purposes.
2. The Applicant should complete the application form and provide all supporting documents in a timely and truthful manner. If the Applicant fails to provide the required information and supporting documents before the deadline specified by TIC, the application will not be processed further.
3. The TIC reserves the final discretion and right to amend this Guide to Application without prior notice.
4. The TIC's decision on accepting or rejecting any application is final.

The designated sites of Category A can be added or removed as recommended by the TIC and agreed by the Government. Travel agents shall liaise with the venue management organisations on their own to enter the following sites.

Conservation and environmental protection code of practice during visits to designated sites of Characteristics Local Tourism

1. Do not write on, mark or damage the exhibits, installations, walls or facilities in the tour sites (“the sites”)
2. Do not make excessive noise in the sites and please put mobile phones and the noise-emitting devices to silent mode. If tour participants must use a mobile phone, they should lower the voice to avoid disturbing others.
3. Please keep the sites and facilities clean and tidy, and follow the photography and filming regulations.
4. No public speeches, lectures or seminars using loudspeakers or other public address equipment are allowed on the site without prior permission from the management.
5. Tour participants must respect other visitors and the staff of the sites.
6. Food involving endangered species, namely shark fin, bluefin tuna, humphead wrasse, wild caught Hong Kong grouper, sturgeon caviar and black moss, should not be offered in meals.
7. Distribution of single-use disposable plastic materials such as bottled water, plastic bags and plastic tableware should be avoided as far as possible.
8. Tour participants should be encouraged to prepare their own water bottles and drinking water, and take the litter away after the tour activity(ies), in particular from country parks, marine parks, special areas, etc.

Guidelines for Tourist Experience Activity

Tourist Experience Activity arranged by the Applicant for the tour participants must offer unique and captivating tourism experience of Hong Kong with interactive elements that engage tourists' participation. The activity can be conducted in different formats, including but not limited to the following types of activities:

1. workshops, classes, and activities that promote the “[Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage \(ICH\) of Hong Kong](#)” and the “[first ICH Inventory of Hong Kong](#)” which demonstrate the historical and cultural value, such as the guqin making technique, traditional food making techniques (e.g. Cha Kwo, melon-seed, Hong Kong Style Milk Tea), crafting techniques (e.g. lantern, flower board), sewing techniques of cheongsam and wedding costume, and Bamboo shed theatre building Technique of Cantonese opera (more ICH items and information can be found at https://www.lcsd.gov.hk/CE/Museum/ICHO/zh_TW/web/icho/home.html);
2. Special guiding tours, exclusive dialogue with expert or behind-the-scene visits in relation to social practices, rituals, and festive events, e.g. Jiao Festival, Fire Dragon Dance in Tai Hang during Mid-Autumn Festival;
3. Docent tour, which is related to green ecology, geoheritage and geopark visitor centre, or arranged by relevant environmental protection education facilities;
4. Docent tour, which is arranged by relevant venue management organisation to the list of cultural and heritage sites as listed in Annex I Section I to L (Such docent tour organised for Thematic Travel must adhere to the selected themes as listed in Annex IV).

To ensure tour participants to have a deeper experience and understanding of the people, the history, the food and culture of a place or an activity, the group size for each tourist experience activity should be 50 participants or less.

1. Travel agent shall focus on one of the following six distinctive themes in designing a signature itinerary to offer visitors a captivating and in-depth travel experience in Hong Kong.

 - Include a discovery of the city's hidden gem(s) / redesign a conventional itinerary with unique and creative element(s) / offer a totally new travel experience / feature the district local characteristic and diversity of Hong Kong;
